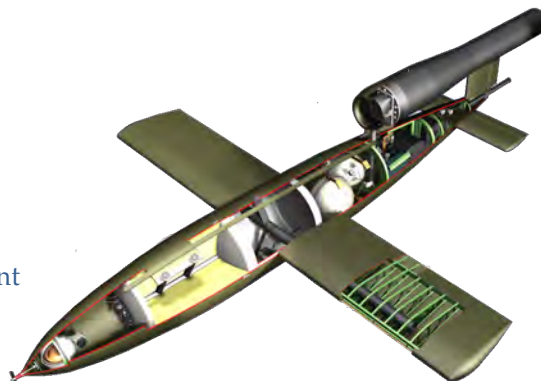
On a sadder note, I've been informed of the passing of Col John Basch. John recently had a cancerous lung removed, but sadly, never fully recovered. ➔

We had mixed success in July and August.

We sent the SBD and P-51 to both Janesville, WI and then on to EAA's AirVenture in Oshkosh. We sold the same number of Rides at both events (26). However, the Oshkosh event was a full week vs. just the weekend at Janesville. Part of the problem was that our fancy Rides tent that we use to attract potential Rides clients was stolen on Tuesday night and we did not recover it until late Thursday. This essentially caused us to miss about 2 days of Rides with only 2 on Thursday and 0 on Friday. They culprits had to return the tent because we advertised on social media that it was missing and we had a retired police chief and a retired DEA Agent on the case! Once the tent was back and folks could see that we were there, our sales rebounded to normal levels. Next year we'll strike the tent each night and take it with us (extra work we never used to do).

We continue to do Rides by appointment at our Airbase on Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Saturdays. We are running into to weather and pilot availability problems, but there is apparently a very large pent-up demand for Rides, likely from folks who have been cooped-up from COVID and are finally getting out.

One of our newest Rides Crew Member, Jim Stearns, did 5 Mustang Rides on Thursday, 19 AUG (4 were appointments and 1 was a "walk up" sell) as he ran things whilst I played hooky at the doctor's office.

The planned off site events for Gilmer County/Ellijay and Cobb County/McCollum airports have both been postponed.

The next big Rides event will be during WWIIHD on 9 October.

The Rides Program is one of our primary means of raising funds to continue our mission. If you are interested in helping with the Rides Program and "learning the ropes", please reach out to Jim or me. We've got a great group of folks helping and there is a lot to do, so we can always use more help. ➔

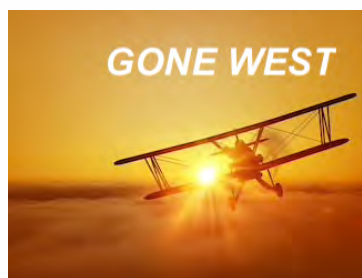

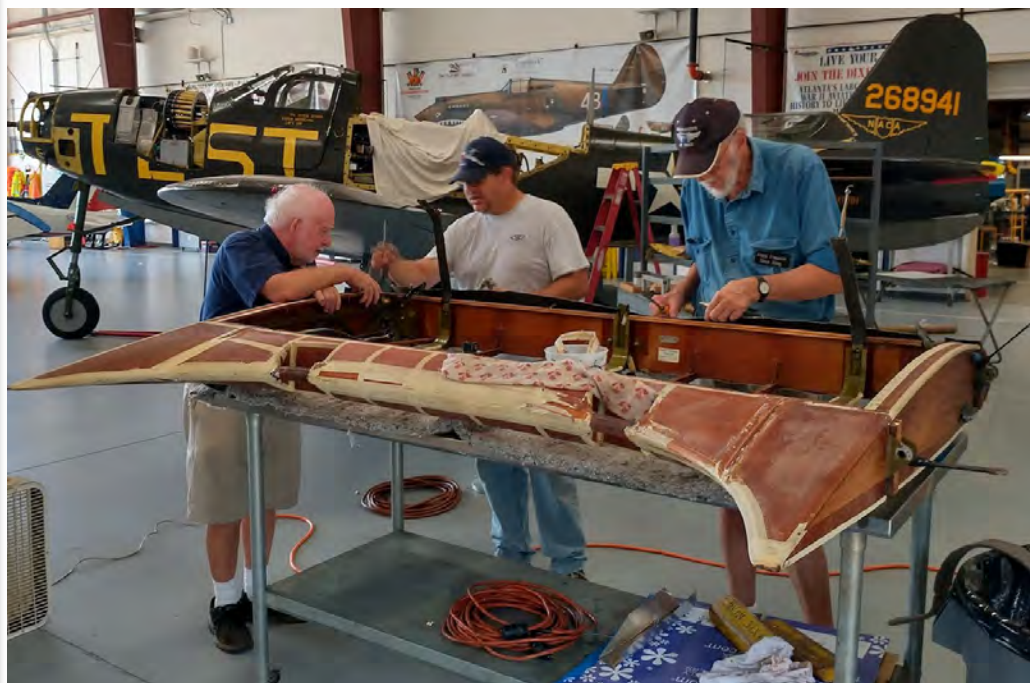

Development Officer Update

As Development Officer, one of my priorities is to support member engagement and project success by assisting members in building plans and teams to implement and sustain their individual projects. Together we can demonstrate to the business, civic and education communities that the CAF Airbase Georgia is a resource that impacts the quality of life in Fayette County and throughout Georgia. Establishing a positive reputation, track record and relationship building are key to all future fundraising success.

Preparation, Persistence and Prudence

2021 has so far provided CAF Airbase Georgia with many wins that are the result of teamwork and persistence; airshow sales, rides and membership growth are all exceeding expectations. Briefing room repairs and renovation are on track to host our first rental in September, "Keep 'em Flying" 1940s Hangar Dance Dinner Dance and Fundraiser and WWII Heritage Days. Our friends in Georgia tourism are promoting our facility.

The COVID-19 Delta variant has disrupted many business and back to school plans as leaders juggle priorities. For CAF Airbase Georgia staff, safety is always a consideration in planning for public events at our facility. Program and project plans for rentals and hosting events follow guidance by Governor Kemp, Georgia Tourism and staff caution. Both the dance and WWII Heritage Days plans include "Go-No Dates" with a decision to proceed based on the most current guidance. In the meantime, the Hangar Dance and WWIIHD teams are carefully planning and preparing to celebrate the 1940s and salute the Greatest Generation.

As I write this report, we have sold 127 tickets or 30% of our available seats. Over 80% of customers are non-members, with several table purchases pending. In the previous five years we hosted the dance, we sold out the dance in less than six weeks. This year the team decided

to separate the dance and make WWII Heritage Days a one-day event with the goal of reducing cost and effort. "Keep 'em Flying" is the only 1940s-theme dance in the Atlanta in 2021. We have sold \$12,000 in dance tickets and WWII Heritage Days tickets and sponsorships. Advertising and media releases are planned for the next four weeks.

- Hangar Tours – Effective Dec 9, 2020, the hangar is advertised as closed to the general public. In the meantime, members are welcome to host friends and family members. EDUCATION & MUSEUM OUTREACH

- 80th Anniversary Pearl Harbor Commemoration and University Partnerships – We are working with Kennesaw State University Museum of History and Holocaust Education (MHHE), FDRs Little White House and the Georgia WWII Heritage Trail to create an 80th Anniversary Pearl Harbor Commemoration program, Dec 4-11, 2021. The SBD and Kate will be featured in the program.
- Georgia World War Heritage Trail – The Heritage Trail is one of only four World War II Trails in the nation and will be promoted domestically and internationally by *Explore Georgia*, the tourism division of the Georgia Department of Economic Development, through their website ExploreGeorgia.org, media outreach and sales efforts. The partnership is planning a series of events that will increase awareness of CAF Airbase Georgia. Souvenir Trail Passports will be provided to visitors when we fully reopen. All members are welcome to visit the trail website at <https://www.georgiawwiitrail.org/>
- Fayette County and Forsyth County Schools – COVID as stalled school reopening, but we have discussing various projects, to include career exploration connection with the US Air Force and other aerospace employers. We are also reaching out to all 13 high schools in Georgia with Aviation and Maintenance pathways. Our education outreach is critical to connecting with foundations and employers that might support our restoration mission.
- CEC College & Career Academy Aircraft Walkaround Series – We have struck a partnership with Central Education Center (CEC), a College & Career Academy located in Newnan, GA, to create an aircraft walk-around segments by working with one of Georgia's most respected college and career academies Broadcast Video Production Classes. The segments will be professionally produced and available for our use on an ongoing basis, i.e., posted on our website for distribution to high school aviation students, JRTOC, etc. The program kick-off has been delayed until the 2021-2022 school year due to COVID-19.
- Docent Program - A visit to the hangar is a powerful recruiting tool and introduction to potential donors. Education Officer Rick Kaczor is working with Willard Womack to review the guidelines and determine how we might repurpose the info for our use in the future. Honoring the Past, Planning for the Future, GSU Intern

As mentioned in my previous reports, Rick Kaczor is leading a Museum Refresh Project in anticipation of our Fall Opening. Peter Hague has joined the effort by prepping the museum. The concept is to reorganize the museum exhibit displays around themes that link our aircraft to classroom learning objectives.

A Georgia State University Graduate Research Assistant in Public History, with the support of GSU faculty, will work with the Museum Refresh Team and provide us with a strategy, guidance, and written plans to support our refresh and long-term efforts. The intern will work 10-15 hours week, September 2021-May 2022. Please contact Rick if you are interested in volunteering, richard.kaczor@und.edu.

GSU Intern Donation Update – The cost to onboard the GSU intern is \$4,092 to benefit to the Georgia State University Research Foundation. Two members have generously funded the project.

- WWII Heritage Days (Oct 9) – On May 5th we announced WWII Heritage Days. WWIIHD is our annual open house where many people meet the CAF for the first time. Our 2021 theme will combine a Stearman Fly-in and a Tribute to Rosie the Riveter. Thanks to Stearman Restoration Project Manager Jeff Clark WWIIHD was featured in the Fall edition of Stearman Restorers Association magazine. Our goal is to host 20+ warbirds and transform the event into an annual fly-in. Warbird Rides will be heavily promoted in advance. wwiiidays.org and online registration are now live. So far over 20 organizations and 100 volunteers have so far registered. We have also distributed a media release announcing sponsorship opportunities.
