Safety Update

FIRE PREVENTION WEEK

This year, Fire Prevention Week is 8-14 October. Fire Prevention Week was established in 1925 by President Calvin Coolidge and commemorates the Great Chicago Fire of 8-10 October 1871 (remember Mrs. O'Leary's cow).



Please take this opportunity to give yourself an "annual checkup" on fire safety at home. You can start with these three items:

- 1. Smoke detectors make sure to replace batteries and be sure you have smoke detectors in every sleeping room, outside each separate sleeping area, and on every level of the home. Install them in the basement. Larger homes may require additional detectors to provide a minimum level of protection. Detectors older than 10 years should be replaced.
- 2. Carbon monoxide detectors As the cold weather comes, so does the increased exposure to carbon monoxide (CO) from furnaces and fireplaces (and the ever-present gas water heaters, stoves, cooktops, and automobiles). Many detectors sold today are combination of smoke and CO. Follow the same guidelines for placement as for smoke detectors.
- 3. Fire extinguishers while firefighting should be left to the professionals, it is prudent to have readily accessible fire extinguishers to use against small, contained, incipient fires. In general, you should have an extinguisher within 40 feet of travel and on the same level. If the fire does not go out after using one extinguisher, back out of the area, close the door if possible, and get safely outside and call 9-1-1. Only those who are trained or know how to use a portable fire extinguisher should use one, which is great segue to our next topic!!!

FIRE EXTINGUISHER TRAINING

We are set to do **Fire Extinguisher Training** with the PTC Fire Department on Saturday, 21 October starting at 1000. **This is required training for marshallers per CAF Policy, but is open too all Airbase Georgia Members.** Please send an email to <u>safety@airbasegeorgia.org</u> by Saturday, 14 October if you would like to participate.

HOT TOPIC

We have made great progress on the concerns found by the Peachtree City Fire Marshal's office, completing 5 of the 6 items (thanks to Cols Paulie Areson and Tom Walsh for replacing the missing ceiling tiles in the Meeting Room and AV Closet). We still have some work to do to remove any "permanently installed" extension cords. Please review your work area and remove any extension cords that are attached to the building or other structures (e.g. zip-tied to conduit, piping, etc.). If you need to have permanent power to operate equipment, lights, etc. that currently is being served by the extension cord, contact the Safety Officer and we'll arrange to have an electrician provide proper permanent electrical service.

We will be getting our "re-inspection" from the Fire Marshal's Office in October, so please make this a priority.

The next page is a recap of ABGA Policies on Extension Cords as a reminder.

Safety Update (cont)

ABGA Extension Cord Safety

According to the Electrical Safety Foundation International (EFSI) approximately 3,300 fires yearly are caused by extension cords.

- 1. Always check an extension cord for signs of damage before use.
- 2. Ensure the wattage rating on the extension cord matches your equipment.
- 3. Use cords approved by an independent testing laboratory like Underwriter's Laboratory (UL).
- 4. Always use ground-fault circuit interrupter (GFCI) protection in wet or damp environments.
- 5. Unplug extension cords when not in use.
- 6. Do not "daisy chain" or extend extension cords by plugging them together.
- 7. Do not "permanently" install extension cords by attaching them to a building structure. They are for TEMPORARY USE ONLY.

Residential Type Extension Cords (e.g. lamp cords) are NOT permitted at Airbase Georgia.





THERE'S NO "ME" IN TEAM

- 2. Lock Out/Tag Out Program
- 3. FOD Precautions
- 4. Mounting fire extinguishers and brackets on the tugs

Airbase Georgia's PT-17 *Stearman* Selected as One of CAF's Annual 12 Planes of Christmas.

The Commemorative Air Force will host its annual "12 Planes of Christmas" online giving campaign this December. Designed to support the aircraft of the CAF, the *World's Largest Flying Museum*. This event highlights the efforts of the organization and its volunteer members, who restore and preserve its fleet of over 175 World War II aircraft.

Each year, 12 aircraft of the fleet are selected to be featured during the "12 Planes of Christmas" campaign, each with different historical significance and in various stages of restoration; some need support to become airworthy.

Once again one of the planes assigned to Airbase Georgia has been selected to join 11 other aircraft on the list. Our *Stearman* is in good company, joining two other trainers: Music City Wing's SNJ-4 and New England's PT-23.

PLANE CRAZY

Or I suppose it should be called "Train Crazy." The M-497 was a railcar test bed of the New York Central Railroad, developed and tested in 1966. It used two General Electric J47-19 jet engines. If they look familiar, it is because they came from a Convair B-36 *Peacemaker*.



On July 23, 1966, the car reached a speed of 183.68 mph, an American rail speed record that still stands today.



Next will be red, white, and blue colors on separate days to complete the Army Air Force insignia. Since the wings have completed the final overall color, we have started reassembly by attaching control surfaces. The nosecone was reinstalled, but as of this writing the fuselage remains the last large item requiring final paint.


