



STORY IN MORE THAN FIVE WORDS:

Calamity Jane and a gang of helpers were trying to salvage some artifacts we have stored in our dilapidated storage containers behind the hangar several Saturdays ago. She brought me two framed,



signed and numbered prints (pictured below). My first thought was that they ought to be worth something if they are signed and numbered, so let's auction them off to our members (always thinking of you). A very astute Col Bill Marx said, "Wait a minute there is a note on the back." When he and I read the notes, we discovered these prints were "ON LOAN" to the then, dare I say it DIXIE WING.



I found a contact name I recognized and called Jack Van Ness, a longtime member here now living in Pensacola. Florida, the Cradle of Naval Aviation. It turned out Jack's son-in-law, Lt. Col. Hayward Hornsby, USAF (ret) owned these prints. He wanted to recover them so we made the arrangements and he picked them up from our hangar the 18th of May 2024. Parenthetically, he made a \$1,000.00 pledge to our ongoing pledge drive to complete a much need feasibility study.

This incident initiated some teaching moments, the most important one being that in examining the ABG policy manual, there is an absence of any policies or procedures regarding the acceptance or disposal of donated artifacts, nor are there any procedures in place for artifacts "loaned" to the ABG.

My personal belief is that 1) no artifacts* should be delivered to our location until they have been approved by an appropriate member of the staff; 2) in the future we at ABG take nothing on loan from anybody; and, 3) all donations are final and must be given with no strings attached ... what we do with those items after donation is strictly our business. Without a clear policy and set of procedures regarding the handling of ABG's collection of artifacts – anything goes. We will be working on the development and approval of some basic policies to bring order to the handling of our artifacts in the future.

*artifacts are considered to be items which are typically displayed in a museum type setting and exclude donated machinery, equipment, airplane parts, tools (unless historically of value) ... those should be approved by our Maintenance Officer, Col Randy Hawkins.

The *Stearman* team has started to break down the parts that were assembled for the test rigging. Now the covering process has started. The top right wing has been covered and rib stitching is in progress. The covering for the top left wing has just started. After the top wings are covered, the team will move on to the bottom wings and then the fuselage. With the tremendous support members have contributed to the project, I anticipate continued impressive progress over the next few months. At this rate, we probably need to start thinking about developing a *Stearman* ground school program for our 2025 pilot spring training.




