CAF Airbase Georgia - 2024 Staff Elections Election Day - November 2, 2024

The election for open Airbase Georgia Staff positions will take place during the regular monthly membership meeting on Saturday, **November 2, 2024**. The following staff positions are up for election:

Executive Officer (Incumbent: Col Gerhard Frenz)

Adjutant: (Incumbent: Col Clint Contrell)

Operations Officer: (Incumbent: Col John Currenti)

Maintenance Officer: (Incumbent: Col Randy Hawkins)



Duties of each position entail:

Executive Officer:

The Executive Officer is the Assistant to the Unit Leader and will act in his/her place during his/her absence. This officer should have similar qualities to the leader:

- background in military or business management
- ability for good public appearance
- adept at public speaking
- a positive demeanor
- preferably have a background in aviation

Specific duties include:

- current knowledge of CAF rules and regulations
- meeting facilities
- Unit socials
- other duties as may be assigned by the Unit Leader

Adjutant Officer:

The Adjutant Officer will record and maintain the permanent minutes of all Unit Staff meetings. He/She will maintain suitable correspondence files concerning the business and activities of the Unit and assure that all required Unit reports are submitted to CAF Headquarters in a timely fashion. Further, he/she will assist the Unit in the timely preparation and dissemination of such correspondence of a general nature. In coordination with the Finance Officer, he/she will maintain the Unit personnel records. He/She will advise the Headquarters' Member Services Department of any changes of the Unit membership, and on a semi-annual (March and July) basis compare their roster CAF UNIT MANUAL UNIT REGULATION SECTION 2 MARCH 2022-2-13.

Elections (cont.)

Operations Officer

Minimum qualifications for Operations Officer, per CAF policy, include all those required for Unit Leader plus a general or military aviation background. If the Unit has one or more CAF assigned aircraft, it is recommended that he/she be a CAF-rated pilot with a basic knowledge of CAF flight operations, including airshows and static displays, and the safety requirements and special considerations of each. He/She should also be well versed in the Aircraft Sponsorship Program. Specific duties include:

- authorizing all flights of Unit assigned aircraft
- operation of ground equipment
- verification of pilot and crew member currency in FAA and CAF ratings and status
- serving as Chairman of the Unit Flight Evaluation Board
- assignment of pilot and crew members for Unit aircraft missions

Maintenance Officer:

should be an FAA licensed A&P or IA. He/She is responsible for proper care and maintenance of all aircraft assigned to the Unit and for ground equipment. Specific duties include:

- scheduling and directing restoration of all CAF aircraft assigned to the Unit
- overseeing activities of Unit aircraft project officers
- clearing all planned expenditures through the Unit Staff
- ensuring that all aircraft are in airworthy condition prior to flight
- maintaining proper records and log books
- ordering parts and supplies
- training aircraft crew chiefs and personnel that operate/use ground equipment

He/She will submit a monthly maintenance and/or restoration report to CAF Headquarters. Communications with CAF Headquarters will be initiated through the office of CAF Chief Aviation Officer.

Nominations Deadline: The deadline to nominate is September 7, 2024 at the membership meeting. Nominees MUST be present at the meeting and agree to the nomination.

<u>Meet the Candidates - September 7, 2024</u>: The Nominating Committee will present the slate of nominated candidates and request nominations from the floor during the September 7th Membership Meeting. Candidates will address the membership to present their qualifications and plans for office.

Absentee Ballots: If you cannot attend the November 2, 2024 election meeting you may request an Absentee Ballot in order to vote. This can be accomplished via email to Election Committee member Yvonne Haley at ychaley@gmail.com or by letter addressed to her at 202 N Lakeshore Dr, Carrollton, GA 30117. An Absentee Ballot will be mailed to you along with candidate campaign statements and Instructions for returning the ballots.

Election Day - November 2, 2024: Paper ballots will be available to all members present and in good standing starting at Noon on Election Day. Your current CAF / Airbase Georgia membership status will be confirmed by the Election Committee (Cols Yvonne Haley, Stephan Kruit) prior to receiving your ballot. Ballots must be cast by 3:00 PM on Election Day.

Safety Update

SEPTEMBER IS "NATIONAL PREPAREDNESS" MONTH

<u>National Preparedness Month</u>, held annually in September, is a good reminder that natural and man-made disasters can strike at any time. It's important to have a planned response when you're at work, on vacation, on the road or at the Airbase.

In 2022, 69,473 weather-related events resulted in 813 deaths and 1,718 injuries. Winter weather, heat, floods and hurricanes resulted in the most deaths that year, <u>according to Injury Facts</u>.

The National Safety Council recommends the following general precautions that apply to many disaster situations:

• Make sure at least one family member knows <u>first aid and CPR</u> (that's YOU if you signed up for our $CPR/1_{4}$ Aid Training)

- Download the FEMA app for resources, weather alerts and safety tips
- Have a family communication plan in place; all members of the family should review and practice the plan
- Have all family members' and other important phone numbers written down or memorized
- Have an emergency kit in your car and at least three days of food and water at home
- Be sure to store all important documents birth certificates, insurance policies, etc. in a fire-proof safe or safety deposit box
- Know how to shut off utilities

BORN TO RUN


When an emergency arises like flooding or a fire, it's time to ESCAPE. We have clearly marked EMERGENCY EXITS and we have posted ESCAPE DIAGRAMS throughout the facility. We need your help to ensure that the EMERGENCY EXITS are not blocked. This WALKWAY in the rear of the Hangar in front of the Artifacts Display has been collecting "obstructions" like unused ladders, parts carts, and even a bicycle. Please ensure the EMERGENCY EXITS are kept clear.







Safety Update (cont.)



RETURN TO SENDER

This is a good time for you to log-in to <u>www.airbasegeorgia.org</u> and make sure your ROSTER information is up to date (ESPECIALLY your EMERGENCY CONTACT). All you need is your Colonel Number and Last Name.

TAKIN' CARE OF BUSINESS

We are working with the Peachtree City Fire Department to develop a "Pre-Fire Plan" where we have a joint walk-through to identify key hazards (e.g. flammable liquids storages, etc.) and safety systems (e.g. fire hydrants, automatic sprinkler system pumper connection, etc.).

Safety Update (cont.)

We need to formalize an EMERGENCY RESPONSE ORGANIZATION (ERO). This ERO details who is responsible for KEY ACTIONS in the event of an EMERGENCY (e.g. fire, injury, etc.). Since we are not a full-time occupied, all volunteer organization (and there is no telling who will be on site from day to day), we are going to need many AIRBASE MEMBERS to volunteer to serve on the ERO as ERO LEADERS. The intent will be that these LEADERS will be CERTIFIED by the SAFETY OFFICER and will understand the overall PLAN and the ROLES for each position.

In the event of an EMERGENCY the LEADER(S) present will ensure all EMERGENCY RESPONSE DUTIES are fulfilled by assigning available MEMBERS present to cover a DUTY. These DUTIES include the following:



• NOTIFIER – contact Emergency Responders (e.g. 911 – Fire Department) and have them MET and DIRECTED to the emergency (we can't rely on the fire alarm alone for prompt notification).

• SPRINKLER SYSTEM CREW CHIEF – in the event of a fire ensures that the Sprinkler System Control valve is FULLY OPEN and assist the Fire Department with any needed valve closures. Also ensures that the fire alarm, sprinkler system, etc. are placed back in to automatic service following any incidents.

• EVACUATION LEADER – ensure that all personnel have safely evacuated and moved to the RALLY POINT away from the Airbase and do not attempt to return until the Emergency Responders give the "all clear". If safe to do so, they will have the FIRST AID KIT and AED brought to the RALLY POINT.

• UTILITIES CREW CHIEF – knows the locations and means for shutting off the UTILITIES including the ELECTRICAL POWER, NATURAL GAS, and DOMESTIC WATER and can assist the Emergency Responders as needed/requested.

We will be scheduling Active Shooter Training with the Peachtree City PD following the monthly meetings in SEP, OCT, or NOV (TBD). This will occur following the General Meeting that starts at 1300 (1PM) and is purely voluntary.

EVENT VOLUNTEERS NEEDED

It is almost the end of summer and that means fall weather is coming. With that beautiful season comes a lot of events. If you were not aware, our facilities rentals provide a substantial revenue to keep our organization

in operation. The only way we can provide these rentals is by having a strong member base to serve at the events. In the past, this burden has fallen on a select few, and that can be a lot to carry alone. Therefore, we are calling all members to help serve at events we host.

Event service does not require any long-term commitment. We try to keep our operations calendar up to date with the upcoming events we are

hosting so that you can plan ahead to serve. Most times, the roles offered include assisting with parking (directing vehicles/driving golf cart shuttles), event setup/breakdown (setting up/taking down tables, chairs, and décor), event guest service (providing direction to the guests, answering questions, making accommodations), and facilities maintenance (keeping bathrooms stocked and emptying trashcans). If that sounds like work, it's because it is! But this is a large revenue generator for our operation, and an incredible way to serve our community with networking and outreach. I'm not



sure if I'm supposed to mention this, but sometimes there's even free food!

Off-site events are just as important, as it is our way to represent Airbase Georgia in our community. Most times this includes discussing our mission with and purpose guests, answering questions about our organization and how to become involved, helping set up our tent and PX and serving customers, and providing information about our featured aircraft.

Keep in mind, even if you can't serve for the entire event, you can still help. Many times, our members will work different shifts to keep the events running smoothly. It is important that we staff these events properly for full coverage to make a positive impact on our guests. Please help to notify us as early as possible if you can assist.

Stearman Update Col Jeff Clark

The covering process on the *Stearman* continues. We are using the Stewart covering process, which has multiple steps that must be completed for each component of the airplane. At a high level, these steps are:

- 1. Cut the fabric to shape, glue it to the structure, and use an iron to shrink it to fit.
- 2. Rib stitch the fabric to the underlying structure.
- 3. Install inspection rings and apply fabric tape over the rib stitches and around component perimeters
- 4. Clean and pre-finish in preparation for primer
- 5. Apply filler/UV blocker primer coat
- 6. Apply final paint top coat

There are several different components going through this process. Here is where they all stand:

- Vertical and horizontal stabilizers: Step 5 completed primer applied
- Elevators and rudder: Step 5 completed primer applied
- Left and right ailerons: Step 5 completed primer applied
- Center section: Step 5 completed primer applied
- Top right wing: Step 5 completed primer applied
- Top left wing: Step 4 completed pre-finish completed, ready for primer
- Bottom right wing: Step 1 in progress fabric being applied
- Bottom left wing: Step 3 complete ready to start pre-finish

The covering process is not difficult, but there is a lot of work to do. If you would like to like to learn this lost art, the *Stearman* team would welcome your help! \rightarrow






