Movie Night in the Hangar Honors the life of U.S. Pilot Cornelia Fort Public Information Officer, Col Steve Forsyth

Cornelia Fort was not a famous WWII hero, but her heroic story was brought to life at our hangar transformed into a movie house on June 28 at CAF Airbase Georgia.

The public was invited to a special screening of the documentary, "Crosswinds – the Courageous Life of Cornelia Fort," and it was an inspirational experience as researched and presented by Judy S. Miller and Redwood Educational Technologies.

Early in her flying career, Cornelia Fort was a flight instructor with a student in an Interstate L-6 Cadet over the skies near Pearl Harbor on



Dec. 7, 1941, when Japanese fighters suddenly appeared around her. She immediately dropped down to her Hawaiian airfield, but not without being shot at by the fighters. She and her student were not injured, but they had no idea of the devastation taking place in the harbor.

Determined to serve her country, Fort joined the newly formed Women's Auxiliary Ferrying Squadron (WAFS) in September 1942. She was the second woman accepted into the program. She began ferrying new aircraft to their delivery points throughout the United States. Often the pilots would fly in formation to a base, deliver the aircraft and find their way home to pick up a new delivery.

On one of these trips, a mid-air collision in Texas caused her to become the first female U.S. pilot killed in service to her country.

Her heroic story was told as part of a special public program organized by Col Mark Richards, with a bigscreen video display, special audio equipment and a concession stand complete with sodas, popcorn and



candy. Almost 200 people requested free tickets online, and about 100 attended during a stormy night. The documentary will be screened again at EAA AirVenture this month in Oshkosh, Wis., and later will be available via streaming.

"Her story, nearly lost to time, reminds us that courage means taking the first step forward – especially when you are among the first to do so," said Col Chris Madrid, who coordinated the screening with Miller. "She became a pilot in the time when very few people were pilots and even fewer were female."

The movie night included a display of Airbase Georgia's PT-19, one of the aircraft Fort flew during her short career as a military pilot. Leslie Sargent, retired from the FAA, also attended and commented on Fort's final flight and the possible circumstances that caused the mid-air collision that took her life. Several Airbase Georgia members helped make the evening possible, setting up and taking down the event, as well as serving as docents or participating in WWII-era costumes. Kelly's Zeroes also prepared a WASP display complete with flight suits and many articles that were issued to the female pilots. \bigstar

Safety Update Col Steve Hoofnagle, Safety Officer

August is Travel Safety Awareness Month

We are in the middle of the "airshow season", so our planes, pilots, crews, and Rides personnel are traveling extensively. Many of us are taking some time for a getaway or vacation. Please take some time to plan ahead with the travel safety tips below.



- 1. Vehicle Maintenance even if you're flying, you're getting to the plane in your vehicle. The hot weather is hard on vehicles, especially cooling systems and batteries. Be sure to plan ahead to get all of your deferred or upcoming preventative maintenance done. Check your tire pressures and critical fluids including oil, coolant, brake, power steering, etc. (this should be done monthly). Low tire pressure and hot pavement are a recipe for blow-outs.
- 2. Heads-Up If you are traveling long distance, be sure to check on Travel Advisories (links below).
- 3. Over There If you are going out of the country, be sure that your passport will not be expiring within 6 months. Make two photocopies of your passport identification page. This will facilitate replacement if your passport is lost or stolen. Leave one copy at home. Carry the other with you in a separate place from your passport.
- 4. Protect the Home Front Arrange to stop your mail, newspapers, and other routine deliveries. Have a neighbor keep plants watered, pick up packages, and check the house from time-to-time. Leave copies of your itinerary, passport data page and visas with a trusted friend or family member, so you can be contacted in case of an emergency.

5. Spy vs. Spy - Be careful about sharing travel details online. Your Facebook friends aren't the only ones looking at your profile.

6. Liberty Bibberty - Travel insurance can cover unexpected expenses from trip cancellations, medical emergencies, or lost luggage. Check with your health insurance to make sure you will be covered away from home, especially if traveling out of the country.

Please watch for signage indicating testing is in progress as you may hear the alarms sounding.

It's HOT!!! Yeah, but it's a "Dry Heat"!!!

It goes without saying that the hot/humid weather continues in beautiful "North Viet-Georgia". Working in the Hangar, out on the ramp, or at offsite events exposes us to the hazards of heat exhaustion, heat stroke, and dehydration. There are warning posters in the Hangar, Shop, and restrooms to alert you to the signs of these hot weather hazards. The Hangar also has a thermometer with a hygrometer (measures the humidity) and can give guidance when it's time to take a short break or take a break for the rest of the day. Be sure to refer to these resources, stay hydrated, and KEEP AN EYE ON EACH OTHER!

Headed to Oshkosh - Crosswinds Takes Flight

Airbase Georgia is proud to participate once again in **EAA AirVenture Oshkosh**, the world's largest aviation celebration. Our WWII-era aircraft will be on display and performing in daily showcases, sharing living history with thousands of aviation enthusiasts.

A special highlight this year is the **July 26 screening** of *Crosswinds: The Courageous Life of Cornelia Fort*. The documentary, produced in partnership with **Redwood Educational Technologies**, introduces audiences to Fort's trailblazing story as the first American woman to die on active military duty during WWII. Her legacy continues to inspire aviators and educators alike.

Peachtree City Screening a Local Success
