

WWII History at Airbase Georgia

For over twenty years, Airbase Georgia has hosted field trips for history and aviation students from Fayette, Coweta, Spalding, and Clayton counties. In 2025, Airbase Georgia partnered with Fayette County Public Schools to co-design a World War II history immersion experience aligned with Georgia's Curriculum Standards. The curriculum will be made available to all 1,500 5th-grade students in Fayette County Public Schools January-February. Early feedback from teachers and students has been positive and enthusiastic. Development Report

Three Years. One Aircraft. Extraordinary Generosity.

As Airbase Georgia's Development Officer, one of the most meaningful parts of my role is seeing how deeply our mission resonates with people, year after year, gift after gift. The results of the 2025 *12 Planes of Christmas* campaign for our Airbase Georgia P-47N Thunderbolt are a powerful reminder of that connection.

For the third consecutive year, donors contributed more than \$100,000 toward the restoration of this remarkable aircraft. In 2025, 95 donors gave more than \$105,000, far exceeding our modest \$25,000 goal. It was an unexpected and deeply humbling outcome, one that speaks not just to generosity, but to trust.

What makes this year especially meaningful is that many of these donors have supported the P-47N project from the very beginning. They have stayed with us because they have seen, up close, the dedication, craftsmanship, and reverence our volunteers bring to this aircraft and to the history it represents.

Restoring One of the Last Flying Thunderbolts

More than 15,000 P-47 Thunderbolts once filled the skies during World War II. Today, only about 13 remain airworthy in the United States. Airbase Georgia's P-47N is one of the most historically significant survivors, an aircraft originally acquired by CAF founder Lloyd P. Nolen.

Built in 1945, this Thunderbolt served with the Puerto Rico Air National Guard and later the Nicaraguan Air Force, where it saw combat. It last flew in 2006 and entered full restoration in 2022 after Airbase Georgia assumed stewardship.

This restoration is not about returning an airplane to static display. It is about preserving a living piece of history so the Commemorative Air Force can continue to Educate, Inspire, and Honor—not just through stories, but through flight.

Three Years of Steady, Meaningful Progress

Because of donor confidence and volunteer commitment, the P-47N restoration has advanced steadily since 2022. Major accomplishments include:

- Cataloging and organizing thousands of original parts
- Repairing wing damage and machining intricate fittings
- Partnering with AirCorps Aviation to fabricate and replace major components
- Restoring cowlings, belly skins, the dishpan, and cowl flaps
- Installing the engine mount and sourcing rare N-model brakes

Across three years, donors have contributed over \$450,000, funding critical components such as ailerons, flaps, rims, leading edges, and major structural assemblies. Inside the hangar, thousands of volunteer hours have transformed a complex collection of parts into a structurally advancing airframe.

Several donors have shared with us that they continue to give because they see how carefully this aircraft is treated, not as a project to rush, but as a legacy to steward. That perspective matters, and it is something our volunteers embody every time they step into the hangar.



Safety Report

This month's safety topic is an introduction to CAF's Safety Management System, which is the fancy, organizational way of saying we are looking out for each other in everything we do here at Airbase Georgia. You will hear CAF promoting a "Just Culture of Safety" as a means to ensure that any member can feel confident, they will have CAF's support when bringing a safety issue to the organization's attention. Such a commitment is codified in CAFR 60-4 Safety Management System in this statement by David Oliver, the President/CEO of CAF:

"Your most important duty is to keep our operations safe, stop dangerous activities on the spot, and openly and honestly report unsafe events and hazards. You can tell me or any supervisor, email me, or call in on the phone if you are away from the hangar. You can be assured that such reports will be thoroughly investigated non-punitively..."

Safety management is big on models, so here is one to guide your treatment of hazards:

OBSERVE

CORRECT

- Fix it, or
- Find someone else who can

REPORT

REPEAT

OBSERVE your environment as you conduct business, either in the Airbase Georgia facility or on the flight line at rides or airshow events and be wary for unsafe conditions or practices.

CORRECT a situation you consider unsafe - don't just pass it by or allow the operation to continue. If you are unqualified or unequipped to fix the problem, get help.

REPORT generally means to make sure someone else is made aware of the hazard and how it was mitigated, and presumably a plan will be formulated to avoid such a hazard in the future.



CAF accepts and embraces the close relationship our small operation allows between members and supervisors. A discussion that makes its way to either Col Randy Hawkins (MX) or Co John Currenti (OPs), for example, will satisfy the intent to identify and mitigate hazards and has been the hallmark of our safety processes thus far. A formal process for hazard reporting exists, and we will expand upon it next month.

CAFR 60-4 Appendix B has this to say about reporting hazards:

"Historically, this formal process is rarely used; the atmosphere in our work areas and the easy access to management encourage face to face reporting.

...Furthermore, the face to face and immediate discussion of the issues allows for quick mitigation..."

Finally, REPEAT - remain vigilant and keep communication going. Consider me for reporting a safety hazard if a more direct supervisor is not available. ★

Education Officer Report

Carrying the Mission Forward: The 2026 Education Plan

As I step into the role of Education Officer, I want to begin by acknowledging something that cannot be overstated: the 2026 Education Plan approved by the Staff in the Jan 17th Staff Meeting is made possible by the hard work and commitment of Airbase Georgia volunteers over the past twenty-five years.

This plan does not represent a new direction for Airbase Georgia. Instead, it formally recognizes and supports the education work that members have been doing for decades, welcoming visitors into the hangar, interpreting World War II history through the restoration and flying of historic aircraft, and helping the public understand why preserving and flying these aircraft still matters.

Education and Aircraft: One Mission

The Airbase Georgia Education Program exists to strengthen public understanding and support for the aircraft we restore, maintain, and fly. Education is not separate from aircraft operations. Education is one of the ways the mission of the Commemorative Air Force is carried forward and sustained.

Every tour, school visit, career conversation, and public engagement connects people directly to the aircraft themselves. We help the public understand why they were built, how they were used, and what it takes to keep them flying today. In this way, education is not an add-on to our mission; it is a core expression of it.

Continuity from Development to Education

In my Development Officer reports throughout 2025, I focused on strengthening Airbase Georgia's long-term sustainability by clarifying priorities, aligning programs with mission, and ensuring volunteer effort is supported by clear structure.

The 2026 Education Plan reflects that same philosophy. Education at Airbase Georgia has always been volunteer-driven. What the Staff-approved plan does is organize and reinforce that work, ensuring

our education efforts remain sustainable, mission-focused, and responsive to the community we serve.

What the 2026 Education Plan Is and Is Not

Before highlighting the approved plan, it is important to clarify its scope.

The 2026 Education Plan:

- Reflects existing, proven programs already familiar to our members
- Introduces three proof-of-concept initiatives developed in response to K-12 educator and community feedback
- Remains firmly grounded in our aircraft, flight operations, and living history mission
- Has been reviewed and approved by the Staff as the formal education framework for 2026

Additional education-related activities may occur throughout the year in coordination with partners or volunteers and will be communicated separately as staff approval and details are confirmed.

Staff-Approved 2026 Education Plan Dates

The following activities are explicitly included in the Staff-approved 2026 Education Plan:

- **Year-Round** - Docent-led tours, open hangar days, and education integrated into Airbase Georgia events
- **Spring 2026** - WWII History Curriculum and Aviation Career Awareness programming in partnership with local education and workforce organizations
- **April 15, 2026** - Airbase Georgia Aviation Career Fair (pilot program)

- **Summer 2026** - Youth aviation education workshops and educator collaboration initiatives
- **Fall 2026** - Continued WWII history programming aligned with school calendars and community events

Looking Ahead: January–April Volunteer Opportunities

Several Staff-approved education activities are scheduled for the first part of 2026, and member participation will be essential to delivering these programs with the quality and care our audiences expect.

- **January 12 – February 13**
Fayette County Schools: 5th Grade WWII History Immersion Curriculum
 Volunteers support student engagement through living history interpretation and aircraft-centered storytelling aligned with Georgia's WWII curriculum standards.
- **February 8, Noon-4pm**
Super Museum Sunday – Georgia History Festival
 Volunteers assist with public history interpretation and community engagement, helping connect visitors to Airbase Georgia's aircraft and mission.
- **February 16 – March 6**
Georgia Journeys: Legacies of WWII
KSU Museum of History & Holocaust Education Exhibit
 Volunteers support public-facing interpretation and partner engagement tied to WWII history and remembrance.
- **February 24 – 26**
Fayette Works – Career Exploration Event
 Volunteers engage students in aviation career awareness by connecting WWII aviation history to modern aviation and aerospace opportunities.
- **April 2**
Fayette Chamber of Commerce Civics Bee
 Volunteers assist with public history engagement and community education.

- **April 15**
Central Education Center (CEC) Aviation Career Fair
 Volunteers will be needed for set-up, aircraft interpretation, student engagement, and logistics in support of this pilot aviation career awareness program.
- **April 18**
National History Day – Georgia Humanities and LaGrange College
 Volunteers support student history programs and public interpretation tied to WWII education.

Members interested in supporting any of these activities are encouraged to watch for volunteer calls and sign-up opportunities as each event approaches. Specific roles and time commitments will be communicated separately as details are confirmed.

Honoring the Work Already Done

The most important point I want to leave with our membership is this:

The 2026 Education Plan does not replace volunteer initiative, it honors it.

Every tour given, every question answered, and every story shared over the past two decades created the foundation that allowed this plan to exist. The Staff's approval of the 2026 Education Plan is both a recognition of that work and a commitment to support it more intentionally going forward.

I am grateful for the trust placed in me as Education Officer, and I look forward to working alongside our volunteers to ensure Airbase Georgia continues to educate, inspire, and preserve the legacy we are entrusted to carry forward. ★


